This person must take antidiabetic medication every day and must check their blood sugar level (blood sugar level). When she travels, she must have various essential items in her possession:

- ☐ Antidiabetic medication in tablets
- ☐ Injectable medication (insulin or antidiabetic) with needles (Keep Cold)
- ☐ Glucometer with test strips, lancing devices and needles
- ☐ Glucagon Kit
- ☐ Sharps container
- ☐ Insulin pump with cannulas and tubing *
- ☐ Continuous blood glucose meter including replacement sensors and transmitters*
- ☐ Other material _____

***IMPORTANT**

DO NOT EXPOSE THE INSULIN PUMP AND CONTINUOUS GLUCOSE METER TO X-RAYS, BODY SCANNER OR METAL DETECTORS (FIXED OR MANUAL). X-rays and electromagnetic fields can affect the mechanical operation of the device, causing serious risks to the traveler. The Canadian Air Transport Security Administration recommends that a person wearing an insulin pump and continuous glucose meter notify security officers so that a physical search can be conducted. These devices and components cannot be removed.
